- Tenant farmers exploring agrivoltaics as a service.
- New and beginning farmers seeking to start agricultural enterprises that involve agrivoltaics.

Attending the webinar is NOT a prerequisite for applying to the training program.

Training program participants will receive

- Access to extensive resources and information about agrivoltaics.
- Training on a range of topics related to establishing an agrivoltaics enterprise, including sources of funding and considerations for leasing.
- Personalized mentoring and technical assistance from industry experts.
- Guidance on navigating discussions with solar developers.
- Access to existing agrivoltaics projects via in-person site visits.
- Opportunities to connect with industry experts and other farmers.

While training is primarily targeted at producers in New York and New Jersey, farmers across the Northeast are encouraged to attend either Agrivoltaics 101 webinar to learn more about agrivoltaics and to see if they are a fit for our training program.
